4. Philip St. George Cooke was J.E.B. Stuart's father-in-law, John Cooke was Stuart's brother-in-law. It shows that families were divided. Stuart and John Cooke joined the Confederacy; Philip St. George Cooke stayed in the U.S. Army.
5. April 3
6. They passed laws to disenfranchise blacks, supported segregation or Jim Crow laws and worked for home rule.
7. Southerners built monuments and held reunions.
8. Virginians have debated having a Confederate History Month, the Boy Scout's Robert E. Lee Council has been changed to the Heart of Virginia Council, the insignia for the Virginia Air National Guard has been changed.
