



## **Three Experiences for One Low Price! The American Civil War Center, Museum of the Confederacy, and National Park Service Offer Joint Ticket**

Visitors to Richmond can experience the Civil War full circle for one low price as the American Civil War Center *at Historic Tredegar*, the Museum of the Confederacy, and the Richmond National Battlefield Park Visitor Center offer a joint ticket to view all three sites. Beginning on Friday, May 22, 2009, visitors can purchase the **Richmond Civil War Pass** joint ticket for \$15, a savings of four dollars.

Located on the grounds of the historic Tredegar Iron Works, the American Civil War Center explores the war's causes, course, and legacies from Union, Confederate and African American perspectives through exhibitions, tours, and public programs. Visitors can orient themselves to local battlefields and learn about the city's pivotal role during the war by touring the Richmond National Battlefield Park Visitor Center, also located on the Tredegar campus. The Museum of the Confederacy houses the world's largest collection of artifacts associated with the Confederate States of America, and offers tours of the White House of the Confederacy, the fully restored wartime home of President Jefferson Davis, adjacent to the museum.

Tickets can be purchased at each location.

Joint ticket admission will be discounted to \$12 during January and February when the White House of the Confederacy is closed to the public.
